This database contains bibliographic records of the old prints described in the printed version of the *Knihopis of Czech and Slovak Early Printed Books from the oldest time to the end of 18th century* (eds. Z.V. Tobolka, F. Horák, B. Wižďálková, Praha 1939-1967). Original founder and operator of the internet version of *Knihopis* (Bibliography) was the Cabinet for Classical Studies of the Institute of Philosophy of The Czech Academy of Sciences. In 2015 the National Library became the administrator of this database. It is being supplemented and continued till today. Since the end of 2014 there have continuously been added hyperlinks to the digital copies of old printed books from the collections of National Library to the database.

This bibliography includes Czech and Slovak books from the beginning of printing to 1800. It contains the union listing of libraries that hold the titles. Vol. 1 includes incunabula. The entries are arranged alphabetically by the author or by title.

Bibliographic database including the printed production of *foreign-language bohemians* from the 15th-18th century. Although it's not reflected in the title, incunabula are also included in this database, they have their own identity number, which starts from INC. The database covers:

- foreign language publications printed on the nowadays territory of Czech Republic, regardless of the author's nationality and literary genre (only official prints are not included);
- foreign editions of foreign language works by authors from the nowadays territory of Czech Republic;
- works of foreign authors in foreign language published abroad, if the content of these works or the author's personality is related to Czech, Moravian or Silesian area (within today's borders of the Czech Republic).

The *Portal of the History of Czech Book Culture up to 1800* is a new project of the Department of Historical Bibliography of Academy of Sciences Library and Manuscripts and Early Printed Books Department of National Library of the Czech Republic. It connects both databases (KPS and BCBT) to search bohemical early prints regardless of the language of publications. The Portal also includes the online *Encyclopaedia of the Book in the Czech Middle Ages and in the Early Modern Period* and *Map of Printed Production in Bohemia and Moravia up to 1800* (interactive electronic instrument for searching according to printing locations).
