Selection criteria: Till the 1990s, selection criteria for the Serbian National Bibliography were quite wide. They included publications concerned with the other nations of former Yugoslavia. According to modern criteria, established by the Bibliographical Department of the NBS, National Bibliography includes all books printed on the territory of modern Serbia, regardless of the language and nationality of the author, then the books printed outside of Serbia in Serbian language and books by Serbian authors printed abroad, regardless of the language of publication.

Printed *Serbian Bibliography* includes books issued in **1868-1944**. It contains over 100,000 entries. Bibliography was published by the National Library of Serbia from 1989 to 2008 in 20 volumes. It continues chronologically *Serbian*

Bibliography covers Serbian books and periodicals from 1741-1867 which are presented chronologically by publication date. There are almost 3300 entries in this bibliography with indexes for subject, author, title without author, publisher, and historical name. At the end of the book is a table with statistics on the number of items per year.

Bibliography includes over 6000 records of books, periodicals (calendars, almanacs) and occasional publications. It was compiled during the preparation of the "main" bibliography covered books from 1868 to 1944. (•NB: *IFLA*: "is existing in our databases and it is in preparation for printed form". Serbian Bibliography of the 18th century includes over 400 Serbian books from 1701-1800. The entries are arranged by year, with extensive annotations and bibliographic notes. Also reproductions of title pages and bibliographic references for bibliographies in which the item is cited are provided for almost every item. Locations of libraries in Former Yugoslavia are listed at the end of the entries. It

was issued as part of a planned Serbian retrospective bibliography of which only this volume has been produced so far. There is an index for author and title without author.

• Hrkalović, Janko (1971). *Katalog retkih srpskih knjiga 1741-1941*. Beograd: Izdanje autora.

Catalogue of the Rare Serbian Books covers Serbian titles from 1741-1941. It can be useful in the absence of a completed, comprehensive retrospective bibliography of Serbian titles. Besides books, some series and periodicals are listed. Part 1 – books published in Yugoslavia; Part 2 – books published about Serbia (and other parts of Yugoslavia) outside of Serbia. At the back are lists of periodicals and series with their dates of publications and analyzed titles.
